MacGregor State School is an Enrolment Managed School. This means that all students who live within the local catchment area and are eligible for the enrolment in a state primary school, can apply for enrolment at MacGregor State School.

Due to a high number of enrolments from within our local catchment area, we are currently unable to offer places in Years 1-6 at our school for families from outside the catchment area. Families are encouraged to submit the *Application for Enrolment Form* to register their interest and be placed on our waiting list, should places become available. Please note that enrolment applications only remain on the waiting list for the current year.

If you are not an Australian resident or citizen, or a child of an Australian resident or citizen, please contact Education Queensland International (EQI - https://eqi.com.au/contact-us) in the first instance for the information on how to enrol in a local Government school.

ENROLMENTS WITHIN CATCHMENT

If your child resides within the local catchment area, please complete the enrolment documents below.

When submitting enrolment forms, please come prepared with the correct documentation.

To ensure that all of our students from the local catchment area are able to attend their local school, our Enrolment Management Plan provides clear directions on how enrolment applications will be managed. The school Principal will reserve places for students who move into the catchment area throughout the school year.

Parents or legal guardians who wish to enrol their child at the school will need to demonstrate that the student's principal place of residence is within the catchment area. Current **proof of residency** at the address indicated can be provided by way of one of each of the following:

- One primary source a current lease agreement, or rates notice, or unconditional sale agreement
 and
- One secondary source a utility bill (e.g. electricity, gas) showing this same address and parent's/ legal guardian's name

The following documents will be accepted as proof of residency:

O Utility bills (e.g. water bill) or a series of bills at the same address over a sequential period to demonstrate continued/ongoing residency
O Electoral Roll verification letter
O Mobile phone statement (with current address details)
O Driver's Licence (with current address details)
O Bank statement (with current address details; financial details are not required)
O Tax Assessment Notice (financial details are not required)
O Documents demonstrating recent change of address / relocation to within the school's catchment area

(e.g. proof of sale or termination of lease for the previous principal place of residence in a different

catchment).

If the Principal is not satisfied that the documentation provided demonstrates adequately that the address stated in the student's principal place of residence, then the Principal may request further sources of proof of residence showing the same address.

The Principal may also request a properly sworn *Statutory Declaration* from the enrolling parent or legal guardian attesting that the student's principal place of residence is the place nominated in the enrolment application. Any enrolment application supported only by a *Statutory Declaration*, will be conditionally accepted until reviewed and approved by the Principal.

Applicants should note that a false statement/ assertion about the student's principal place of residence may amount to an offence and may be reported to police. The school Principal may repeal a decision to enrol a student in such circumstances.

2024 PREP ENROLMENTS

If your child is born between 1 July 2018 and 30 June 2019, you are eligible to apply for Prep in 2024.

If you are considering *Early Entry to Prep*, please contact the school to arrange to meet with the Principal to discuss the <u>early entry requirements</u> and request an application form.

PREP - OUT-OF-CATCHMENT ENROLMENTS

2024 Prep *Expression of Interest* applications will open on **Tuesday, 18 APRIL 2023 from 9:00am**. To ensure the process is equitable, the applications will be recorded in order of receipt, date and time. *Please do not send* the applications prior to this date and time as they will not be processed. Enrolment of students from the outside local catchment area will be available only if capacity exists.

Please complete Expression of Interest Application – OUT-OF-CATCHMENT APPLICATIONS ONLY to register your interest.

All Expression of Interest applications will need to be submitted to Ms Marcia Crichton, our Enrolment Officer, **by email** to mcric14@eq.edu.au

Families will be contacted by MacGregor State School if the school has a vacancy when an out-of-catchment enrolment becomes available, usually **in Term 4**.

All Expressions of Interest Applications will remain on the waiting list until school commences the following year.

Privacy Statement

The Department of Education (DoE) is collecting this medical information in order to address the medical needs of students during school hours as well as during school excursions, school camps, sports and other school activities. DoE will not use this information to make a decision about a prospective student's eligibility for enrolment. The information will only be used by authorised employees of the department and DoE will only record, use and disclose the medical information in accordance with the confidentiality provisions at Section 426 of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006.

It is essential that the school is advised before the prospective student's first day of attendance if the prospective student has any medical conditions. Application to enrol in a Queensland state school

This sheet contains information on how to complete the Application for student enrolment form (SEF-1 Version 8).

Entitlement to enrolment

Under the *Education (General Provisions) Act* 2006 (Qld) a state school must enrol a prospective student if they are entitled to enrolment. While not exhaustive, the following matters may affect a prospective student's entitlement to enrol in a state school:

- if the school has a School Enrolment Management Plan or an Enrolment Eligibility Plan (enrolment is subject to eligibility under the plan)
- the applicant is a prospective mature age student (the applicant can only apply for enrolment at a mature age state school and will be subject to a satisfactory criminal history check, or as a student in a program of distance education. All prospective mature age students must have a remaining allocation of state education.)
- the prospective student is not of correct age for enrolment (relates to Preparatory Year and Years 1 to 6)
- the prospective student has been excluded, or is subject to suspension from a state school at the time of the application
- the school principal reasonably believes that the prospective student presents an unacceptable risk to the safety or wellbeing of members of the school community (application is referred to the Director-General)
- the school is a state special school and the prospective student does not meet the criteria for enrolment in a special school
- the proposed enrolment requires approval as part of a flexible arrangement under s.183 of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 (Qld), and the arrangement has not yet been approved
- the prospective student is not an Australian resident or citizen or the child of an Australian permanent resident or citizen (visa restrictions may apply, fees may be charged, in some cases legislation requires that the prospective student must obtain approval from the Chief Executive via Education Queensland International (EQI) to enrol)
- the school does not offer the year level that the prospective student should be enrolled in
- the prospective student has no remaining semester allocation of state education.
 Enrolment cannot proceed until additional semesters are applied for by the prospective student (or parent on their behalf) and granted.

Prospective student

A prospective student is a person who has applied to enrol at a state school but who has not yet been accepted for enrolment.

Parent's occupation and education

All parents across Australia, no matter which school their child attends, are asked to provide information about family background (answering this question is optional). The main purpose of collecting this information is to promote an education system which is fair for all Australian students regardless of their background.

Court Orders

Any court orders concerning the prospective student's welfare, safety or parenting arrangements should be provided to the school, and the school should also be provided with any new or updated orders.

Name on enrolment form

A prospective student should be enrolled under their legal name as per their birth certificate. There is provision to also record a preferred family and/or given name. The preferred name will be used on internal school documents such as class rolls. The legal name will appear on semester reports unless there is a specific request to use the preferred name only. This request can come from parents/carers or the student (if the student is independent/mature age).

Gender

Information about gender is supplied to the Federal Government to comply with State funding agreements. The gender category with which a person identifies may not match the sex they were assigned at birth. There is no requirement for a student's gender recorded on this form to align with the sex shown on their birth certificate or passport.

Religious Instruction

Religious instruction is a program approved and provided by a religious denomination or religious society. Other instruction relates to part of a subject area that has been covered within the curriculum and may include, but is not limited to, personal research and/or assignments, revision of class work, and wider reading. Information about religious instruction available at the school, and about other instruction, is provided by the school at the time of enrolment and on the school's website.

MACGREGOR STATE SCHOOL Enrolment agreement

This enrolment agreement sets out the responsibilities of the student, parents or carers and the school staff about the education of students enrolled at MacGregor State School.

- let the school know if there are any problems that may affect your child's ability to learn
- ensure your child completes homework regularly in keeping with the school's homework policy
- treat all school staff with respect
- support the authority of school staff thereby supporting their efforts to educate your child and assist your child to achieve maturity, self-discipline and self-control
- not allow your child to bring dangerous or inappropriate items to school
- abide by school's instructions regarding access to school grounds before, during and after school hours
- advise principal if your child is in out-of-home care
- keep school informed of any changes to your contact details or your child's details, such as home address, email address and phone number
- ensure the school is aware of any changes to your child's medical details.

Responsibility of school staff to:

- · design and implement engaging and flexible learning experiences for individuals and groups of students
- inform parents and carers regularly about how their children are progressing
- design and implement intellectually challenging learning experiences which develop language, literacy and numeracy
- create and maintain safe and supportive learning environments
- support personal development and participation in society for students
- foster positive and productive relationships with families and the community
- inform students, parents and carers about what the teachers aim to teach the students each term
- teach effectively and to set high standards in work and behaviour
- clearly articulate the school's expectations regarding the Student Code of Conduct and the Student Dress Code policy
- ensure that parents and carers are aware that the school does not have personal accident insurance cover for students
- advise parents and carers of extra-curricular activities operating at the school in which their child may become
 involved (for example Program of Chaplaincy Services, sports programs)
- set, mark and monitor homework regularly in keeping with the school's homework policy
- contact parents and carers as soon as possible if the school is concerned about the child's school work, behaviour, attendance or punctuality
- notify parents/carers of an unexplained absence of their child as soon as practicable on the day of the student's absence (allowing time for parents/carers to respond prior to the end of the school day)
- deal with complaints in an open, fair and transparent manner in accordance with departmental policy
- treat students and parents/carers with respect.

What is this consent for?

This Consent Form authorises the Department and the State to use the Individual's personal information and copyright material, together with information about the Individual's participation in Departmental and State initiatives, for any use by the Department and the State associated with the purposes identified in Section 6 of this Consent Form. The consent covers the entire or partial use of the Individual's personal information and copyright material in conjunction with other words and images.

This Consent Form does not provide for copyright consent in relation to copyright works an Individual creates in the course of employment (whether or not the material is created in normal work hours or using departmental facilities or equipment). Where copyright material is created by a State employee while performing their duties under the terms of their employment, the copyright is owned by the State as the employer (section 35 Copyright Act 1968). There are limited exceptions to this including, for example, where the copyright material is created by an employee pursuant to a prior agreement with the employer.

Generally, the deciding factor is whether the employee is performing their official duties. In addition, section 176 of the *Copyright Act 1968* applies where the work was created by or under the direction or control of the State. However, moral rights may still apply to copyright material created by an employee. What is personal information?

If the Principal is not satisfied that the documentation provided demonstrates adequately that the address stated in the student's principal place of residence, then the Principal may request further sources of proof of residence showing the same address.

The Principal may also request a properly sworn *Statutory Declaration* from the enrolling parent or legal guardian attesting that the student's principal place of residence is the place nominated in the enrolment application. Any enrolment application supported only by a *Statutory Declaration*, will be conditionally accepted until reviewed and approved by the Principal.

Applicants should note that a false statement/ assertion about the student's principal place of residence may amount to an offence and may be reported to police. The school Principal may repeal a decision to enrol a student in such circumstances.
